#### Year 1 Class Mass

#### **School Building Fund**

Earlier this week, you should have received an email with an attachment about the Diocesan Building Fund. As in previous years, voluntary contributions to the School Building Fund are being requested from all parents with children in our school. The Fund is of great importance in helping meet the 10% liability on building and major repair projects and managing property, as it enables schools to be able to take advantage of Government funding. The voluntary contributions made by parents in respect of children attending our schools play a vital role in this. The Pdf explains that parents can make their voluntary contribution Online and Gift Aid this. Voluntary contributions can also be made by cash/cheque. A Gift Aid Declaration (Form B) is also included as part of the Pdf that parents can complete to boost the value of their voluntary contribution made by cash/cheque.

#### **Medical Updates**

Parents need to provide up-to-date medical information for their child. Please ensure that if your child has a chronic condition, such as asthma that you provide school with an up to date copy of their management plan. Emergency contact information for parents and any additional contacts should also be updated, as well as the names and contact details of your child's specialists/consultants. Submitting this information by **Friday 18**<sup>th</sup> **October** will help ensure your child's health and safety during the winter months. We also ask that you ensure that your child's school inhaler is in date at all times. Thank you for your co-operation.

#### Keeping your child safe online

As technology becomes an integral part of children's lives, it's crucial to prioritise their online safety. Please be aware of age restrictions around Social Media sites. The age of your child as well as their developmental stage and maturity can affect their ability to have a safe and positive experience of social media. Most of the popular social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age before they can register.

Here are some key points to consider:

- 1. **Open Communication:** Encourage your children to talk about their online experiences. Create a safe space for them to share any concerns or uncomfortable situations.
- 2. **Educate About Privacy:** Teach your children the importance of keeping personal information private. Discuss what is appropriate to share online and what should remain confidential.
- 3. **Set Boundaries:** Establish rules about screen time, acceptable websites, and online behaviour. Use parental controls to help monitor their activities.
- 4. **Be Informed:** Stay updated on the apps and platforms your children use. Familiarize yourself with their features and potential risks.
