Please be aware that we also require additional evidence such as baptismal certificates to accompany your online application. This should be brought to the school office before the closing date in January 2025.

Reception Places – September 2025

The online portal https://www.tameside.gov.uk/admissions/psa closes on Wednesday 15th January 2025. Any applications submitted after this time will be submitted as late applications. Please be aware that we require additional evidence such as baptismal certificates to accompany your online application. This should be brought to the school office before the closing date.

Flu Vaccine

We are seeing high numbers of flu cases across the country and the situation is no different in Greater Manchester and Tameside. It is not too late for any children who missed their flu vaccine at school to still get it and get protected. Catch-up clinics are being held for any children in Reception to Year 11. The vaccine is a quick and painless nasal spray or there is an alternative injection available for those who want or need it. Vaccinations are available by appointment only in order to gain consent prior to the vaccination. Appointments can be made by calling 03333 583 397 and choosing option 1.
